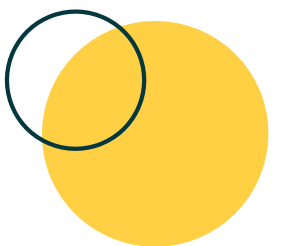
The History of Chocolate

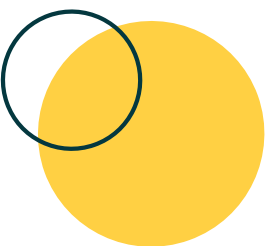

INSTA CAFÉ

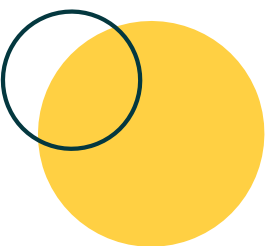
